<u>Easter Play.</u> NPCS staff selected the Easter play, "It's all because of Jesus" which will be performed by our students on April 8th. The NPCSC board reviewed and approved the play. We want to thank the teachers and students for the time and effort they will be putting into this performance.

Preschool teacher. The Neerlandia Christian Education Society requires a pre-school teacher to prepare, coordinate and teach the weekly 3-hr pre-school classes from October 2020 to April 2021 at the Neerlandia Public Christian School. Interested applicants must be available to teach one to two days per week (Monday and/or Wednesday).

Qualifications include:

- Successful applicants must hold a provincial Child Development Supervisor (previously Level 3) certificate issued by the Alberta Government. The training standards for certification are legislated under Part 3 of the Alberta Child Care Licensing Regulation. https://www.alberta.ca/child-care-staffcertification.aspx.
- First aid training is mandatory.
- All successful applicants must submit a current RCMP Criminal Record Check.

Duties include:

- Working as a team and being flexible and adaptable to meet the diverse needs of the class.
- Assisting students with projects, supervising students, and maintaining a safe environment.
- Adhering to all policies and procedures as laid out in the childcare licensing regulations. Details are provided in the pre-school inspection report (Schedule 5 of the Child Care Licensing Regulation).
- Preparing daily plans and play opportunities for the children. The online resource "Play, Participation and Possibilities" is recommended.

- As a Christian pre-school, the successful applicant must include Christian content in the daily plans and play opportunities.
- Additional tasks that need to be fulfilled include holding pre-school registration in the spring (April 2, 2020) for the upcoming school year, and renewing the license every three years.

Pay will depend on experience and education.
