Board approved audited financial statements -Pembina Hills ended the fiscal year in a healthy financial position, and with a planned deficit, the deficit was intentionally generated in order to bring the division's reserves into line with legislated requirements.

The Board Approved Annual Education Results Report - The division continues to measure well in citizenship but has opportunities for growth in scoring on provincial testing. Information Technology (IT) Assurance Report - On an annual basis, Director of Information Technology, Alex Mottus, presents to the Board an overview of their operations as well as some of their main projects. He also discussed some of the challenges that the division will face related to the use of artificial intelligence in education.
