PHSD News

Board approves \$1.5 million from reserves towards the gym expansion for Barrhead Composite High School Modernization and Right-Sizing Project. While Alberta Infrastructure is funding the project overall, an increase in the size of the East gym would fall outside of the scope of the approved (and funded) project.

Trustees approved the 2024-2025 school year calendar. Stakeholders overwhelmingly supported continuing a fall break in November, which resulted in a slightly earlier start date for students, of August 28th, 2024.

The Board accepted the resignation of Superintendent Borgfjord, effective May 31, 2024 (or earlier upon mutual agreement) and has begun the recruitment process for a new Superintendent.
