Principal's Message

During my principal's messages this year, I have reflected a lot on family. I have written about welcoming family, family gatherings, encouraging our family members, and looking at our school family through a creation-fall-redemption-restoration lens. But what about when things aren't harmonious in a family. I know that as a family, we went through some rather trying times during COVID. There were a lot of different opinions, which were very strong. I'm sure many of you will be able to say the same. Some of us have made it through family conflict and we are still together. Others of us are estranged from family members.

I won't pretend to know how to ensure that families stay connected and strong, as I have seen breakdown within my own family that is yet to be healed, but I will look at myself and say what I believe I need to do (even if I don't always do it).

Romans 12:18 tells me that "If it is possible, as far as it depends on you, live at peace with everyone." This particular verse by itself does not say how to do this, but if I look at the verses before and after it, they tell me to "not repay evil with evil," to "do what is right in the eyes of everyone," and "do not take revenge."

Colossians 3:13 says "Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord forgave you." Here too, the verse before gives context, instructing me to have "compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience." and after this it implores me that "over all of these virtues, put on love." I believe this means my motives should be love for others, regardless of the other person's stance.

Proverbs 15:1 reminds me that "a gentle answer turns away wrath," so I should deal gently with others, especially those who are likely to be angered by what I feel I need to share.

I know that this is all easy to say, but difficult to do. Even if I am able to do all of these things, conflict may still arise. This brings us back to the first verse I shared that reads "as far as it depends on you." I feel I need to make sure I am doing the right thing. If I persevere in doing the right thing, I have the best possible chance of healing the relationships that are important and dear to me, as I am endeavoring to do "what is right in the eyes of everyone."

I will pray that our students, staff and greater community will have the understanding and the strength they need to behave in ways that make their relationships strong and keep them strong. Please pray the same for me.

FAQs for Lockdown procedures and drills at Neerlandia Public Christian School

Q. What is a lockdown?

A. If there is a threat inside and/or directly related to our school, our school will be placed in lockdown. Our exterior doors will be locked and staff will direct students to classrooms which will then be locked.

Q. What happens during a lockdown?

A. A staff member will announce over the public address system that the school is in lockdown. Staff will direct students to classrooms where the doors will be locked, the lights will be turned off and the blinds and shades will be pulled down. Depending on the severity of the incident, staff may direct students to move away from door and window sightlines; ask students to take cover and ask them to remain quiet.

How we respond to emergencies at school

Our first priority is the safety, security and well-being of our students and staff. Guided by our division's Emergency Response Plan, we have developed a plan which outlines our school's response to various emergencies.

What should parents do in an emergency?

1. Check the Pembina Hills website

We will post information on the Pembina Hills website <u>pembinahills.ca</u>. Phone the PHSD Regional Services Office at 780-674-8500.

2. Do not come to the school

You could put yourself in danger and get in the way of emergency personnel. In several instances, our exterior doors will be locked and you will not be able to get in to the building.

3. Do not call or e-mail the school

We need to keep our phone lines open to communicate with emergency services.

4. Do not call, text or e-mail your child's cell phone

Depending on the threat, contacting your child's cell phone could endanger your child.

What happens during specific emergencies?

As directed by local emergency personnel we will do the following:

- 1. If an incident or threat occurs <u>inside or is directly related to our school</u>, RCMP will instruct us to **Lockdown** our school which means we will lock all exterior doors. Staff and students will be directed to classrooms which will be locked. (e.g. dangerous intruder)
- 2. If an incident or threat occurs <u>outside</u> and is <u>unrelated to our school</u>, RCMP will instruct us to **Hold and Secure** which means we will lock all exterior doors. Students and staff may move freely in the school. (e.g. a bank near our school is robbed)
- 3. In some environmental or weather-related situations, authorities may direct us to **Shelter in Place**, which means we will keep students and staff in school until it is safe for them to leave. (e.g. chemical spill, blackouts, extreme weather conditions)
- 4. In some instances, we may have to **evacuate** the school. Students and staff will move to the Neelandia Christian Reformed Church, our primary evacuation site. Students will stay at the evacuation site until it is safe to return to school or they are released to a parent/guardian.

Before an emergency happens

- 1. Ensure the school has current Emergency Contact information for your child.
- 2. Talk to your child about the importance of following their teachers' instructions during an emergency.
