Annual Satisfaction Survey Results

Budget Planning for 2025-2026

The Board has approved the allocation formula for the 2025-2026 school year. Like many divisions across Alberta, Pembina Hills is navigating funding challenges due to enrollment changes and shifts in provincial funding. Despite a decrease of \$2.8 million compared to last year, we remain committed to protecting resources that directly support students in the classroom.

Transportation (In-Town)

I wanted to provide an update on **in-town** transportation funding, especially for families with students in ECS to Grade 6.

The provincial government is adjusting the eligibility criteria for funded bus service. Going forward, only ECS–Grade 6 students who live 1.6 km or more from their school will qualify for free, funded transportation.

To help ease the transition, Pembina Hills has opted to utilize bridge funding for the upcoming 2025-2026 school year for students who live between 1.0 and 1.6 km from school — at no cost to families. This gives families more time to adjust before the province’s new standard takes full effect.

I’m always grateful for the opportunity to serve as your trustee and bring your voices to the board table. Please feel free to reach out any time with questions or concerns.
