PEMBINA HILLS SCHOOL DIVISION MESSAGE



Pembina Hills Families,

As you know, the teacher strike is expected to begin on Monday, October 6. Therefore, starting Monday, all Pembina Hills schools will be closed and there will be no classes (including Early Learning) beginning October 6. This includes the cancellation of student transportation, extra-curricular activities and any prearranged trips or scheduled events.

The last day of classes for students will be Friday, October 3, and students will be asked to take home any perishable items and personal belongings they may need. Families will need to make alternate arrangements for their children to ensure their wellness and well-being. You will not need to report your child's absence(s) during the strike. Please note that while schools are closed, some support staff may still be working in schools on non-student tasks or professional learning.

Schools will not be providing any schoolwork to students for the duration of the strike. The Government of Alberta announced it will be offering financial support and educational resources for families. See the <u>Alberta.ca website</u> for more information.

We will continue to provide updates to you through SchoolMessenger, posted on the division news and Labour Action Webpage, and shared on division social media channels as they become available.

We know this is an uncertain and stressful time, and recognize this creates challenges for families. We remain optimistic that a resolution between the Alberta Teachers' Association and the province will be reached soon and that student learning can return as quickly as possible. ADDITIONAL SCHOOL INFORMATION

As you have been informed by Pembina Hills School Division, all Pembina Hills schools, including Neerlandia Public Christian School, will be closed starting October 6, until the teacher strike ends. Teachers will not be replying to school messages during the strike. Additionally, we will not have anyone to answer the school phones or check the school answering machine, so during the strike, we ask that you do not call or come to the school; however, you may contact Pembina Hills School Division at info@pembinahills.ca if you have any school related questions. You may also visit pembinahills.ca/labour-action for updates.

We, the staff members of Neerlandia Public Christian School, have been asked by parents about school work for their children to do during the strike. We do not expect parents to teach their children during the strike, and when the strike is done, we will work with our students to help them learn what they need to learn.

However, if you would like to do educational things with your children, we recommend things that will help your child maintain what they have learned at school. Regular reading, with your child or on their own, and asking them to tell you about what they read, will help maintain their reading and comprehension skills. Journaling about their experiences will help them maintain their writing. Playing games that get them to use their math skills will help them keep strong recall of their basic math facts.

We are very sad to be away from our students and we look forward to working with your children when the strike is done!

PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

When I started as the principal of Neerlandia Public Christian School last year, I was blessed to once again be a part of the PCCE – the Prairie Center for Christian Education. This organization supports many Christian schools in the prairies, especially in Alberta. Thanks to the generous support of the Neerlandia Christian Education Society (NCES) board, and thanks to your financial support for the Neerlandia Christian Education Society, we are members of the PCCE and we have access to the resources from the PCCE.

There were three things from the PCCE that I was most looking forward to when I returned to Neerlandia Public Christian School.

First was the Christian Educators' Convention. Thanks to your support of the NCES, all teachers have the opportunity to attend the convention in October this year.

The second was our Leadership Cohort and the learning I get at the meetings that are held in May. Last year, I had wonderful learning with a leadership support tool entitled "Called, Connected, Committed," which I believe will help me better lead our school in a Christian way.

The third thing was Teaching for Transformation. This method of teaching Christian truths has shaped everything I teach. It helped me to see that there are effective ways to teach really important truths, and in a Christian School, the really important truths of God, through the teaching of the Alberta Curriculum.

A most interesting thing about my reintroduction to Teaching for Transformation is that I was taught NEW ways of preparing to teach Christianly, which I hadn't learned before.

One of the first things a teacher now starts with, when implementing this way of teaching, is to create a Deep Hope for their students. In order for me to apply this, I created my Deep Hope for our school's students and staff. My Deep Hope is that:

In loving community, we will continually discover and grow in our evolving uniqueness and gifting, looking for how God desires to collectively use these in His story.

Mentioning all of this is more than just telling you some of the things I see as important for our staff and students. It is actually to show that I have only one perspective on how to support people. In fact, simply the idea of team (found in my Deep Hope) shows that many people bring different abilities to make things work together much better than any one person can on their own.

PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Could you imagine a hockey team that only had forwards? Or a band that only had percussion? We need everyone playing their unique part, for things to work effectively.

You see, our staff members each have a deep hope for our students, and it may be something like what I have, but it is not identical. Yet it is just as important. As I work on Growth and Team and Service, other staff are focused on instilling things like:

- Children are image bearers of God
- Our identity should be in the awesome perspective God has of us
- Encouraging us to build one another up
- We are created by God, fearfully and wonderfully made, and that shapes our calling.

The cool thing is that no Deep Hope is better or worse than any other. Our Deep Hopes are not in conflict with one another. In fact, our unique Deep Hopes help students to see many important truths from the Bible, as our students move through the grades in our school. That's because our individual Deep Hopes are God given, or God-instilled in us.

We have an incredible team at Neerlandia Public Christian School, all led by the greatest leader (and that's definitely not me), working together to teach our children the really important things.

In addition to these amazing staff members, we are blessed to have the support of you, the members of the NCES, along with the NCES board, to help us guide the students in growing in their relationship with God. Our Jr. High students went to Fawcett to participate in a soccer tournament on Thurs. Oct. 2.


