Principal Message

At the end of January, we sent home progress reports for our students. It was my pleasure to be able to read all of the comments that were written to the students. As teachers, we continually collect progress data, but writing comments reflecting on a students' progress is a bit different.

Report comments come from an analysis of all of the information the teacher has, and they represent a summary of that information. That is the science of comment writing, but the real art has to do with crafting comments that are encouraging as far as what the student has done well, and showing practical ways that students can grow. I must say that I am very pleased with the way our teachers are able to write comments that balance stating areas of positive past performance, with words that encourage growth in a way that is informative and motivational. However, without a doubt, the One who knows how to do this best is our Lord, via practical experiences we have, by inspiring our brothers and sisters to interact with us, and often directly speaking to us through the Holy Spirit.

As recorded in John, when speaking of the Father, Jesus said that "every branch in me that does not bear fruit He takes away, and every branch that does bear fruit He prunes, that it may bear more fruit." (John 15:2) Although this most clearly speaks of how we must remain in Jesus to be fruitful, I believe that this pruning process also happens in multiple areas of our lives.

I am thankful for God's encouragement in my life when I am feeling down, reminding me that He is with me and will support me in the tough times. I appreciate how God sends brothers and sisters to encourage me to continue to do what He desires of me. I am also thankful that the Holy Spirit speaks to my spirit in ways that do not allow me to stagnate in my faith. And although this may be dangerous to write (as I am asking God to keep allowing this to happen) I am thankful for the difficult situations God puts me in, that challenge me and cause me to grow. Jesus tells us that all of these things will allow us to fulfil God's will in a more powerful way, in that "By this my Father is glorified, that you bear much fruit and so prove to be my disciples." (John 15:8)

Principal Message (continued)

One other thing for us to consider is that we need the right motivation as we are used by God to correct our brothers and sisters. Jesus tells us that His commandment is "that you love one another as I have loved you." (John 15:12) That means loving others so much that we would be willing to die for them. (John 15:13). For myself, that means I am not "happy that I showed them" after I am done working to correct someone else, but rather, I feel their hurt over what has gone wrong and I genuinely desire to help and support them in their return to a right standing with God and with others.

I clearly saw genuine care and love for our students when I read our teachers' comments to them. I think that our teachers may have drawn on their own experience with others encouraging them to grow, including the prodding they have received from the Holy Spirit, as they wrote comments for our students. I thank God for the staff that we have, especially that they lovingly help our students discover and grow in their role as co-laborers who play their part in God's story.

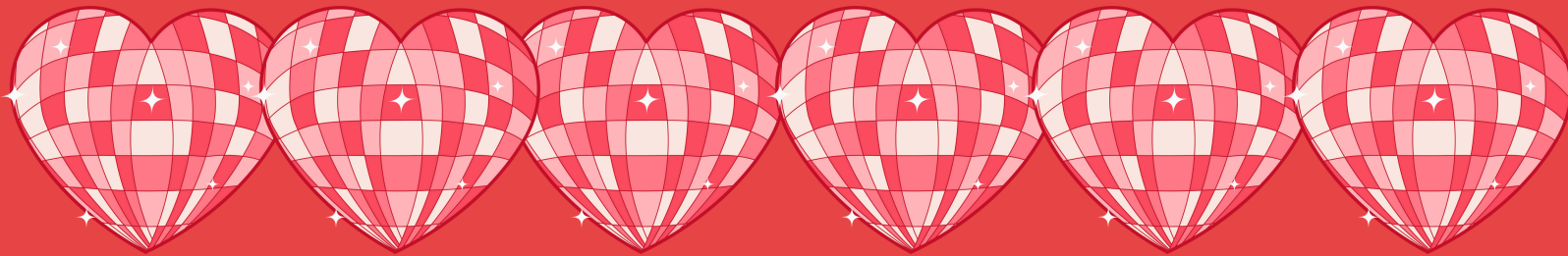

Elementary running teams completed in the Harriers tournament and took home first, second, fourth and sixth place. Well done!

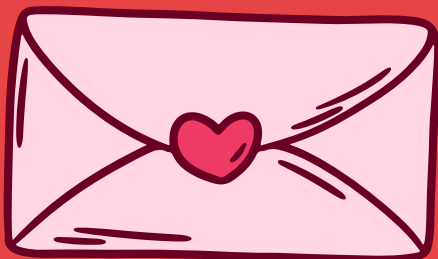
Our Elementary running team is preparing for their final run on Feb. 14, Good luck to all runners.

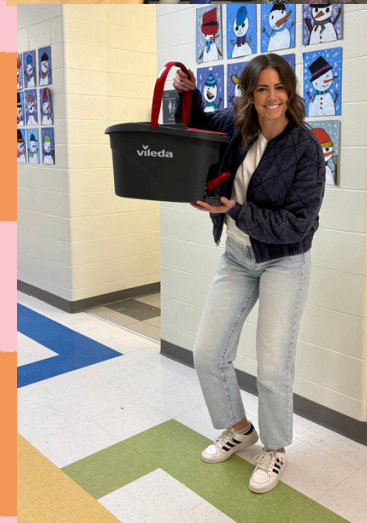

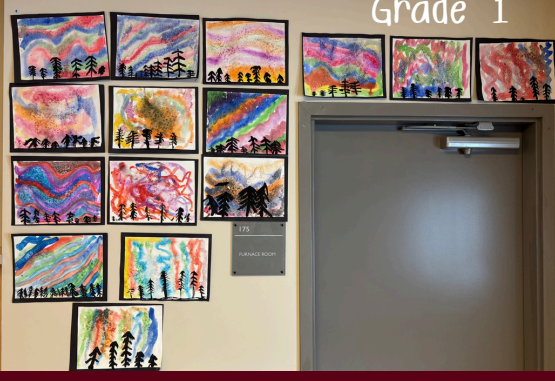

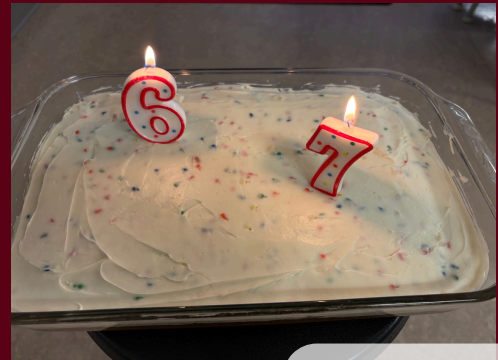
