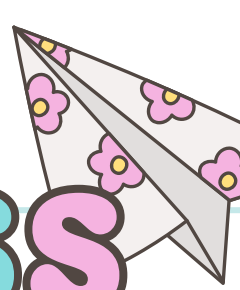

### Notice, Wonder, Love

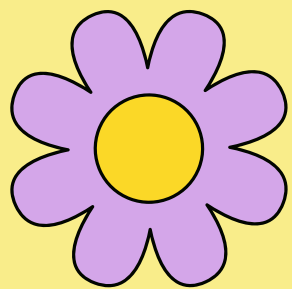
**Deep hope:** is for us to notice, wonder, and love God more as we discover his love in all different colours of His diverse creation

# Principal Message



What do you think about the weather we're having? This is such a common conversation starter, but this year has been something else. In fact, the weather this year has reminded me of the book *The Lion, The Witch and the Wardrobe*, in which until the true king returned to Narnia, they had a never ending winter, as it was "always winter, but never Christmas." 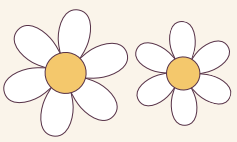

## **Strategic Priorities for our Three-Year Education Plan**

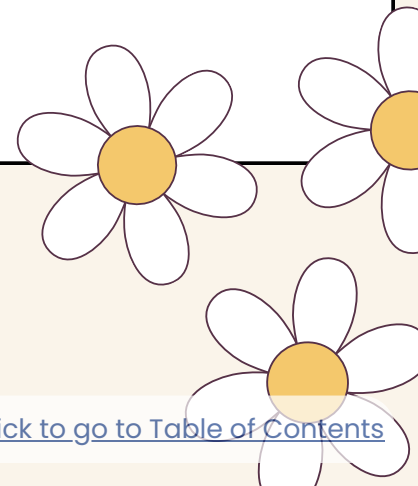
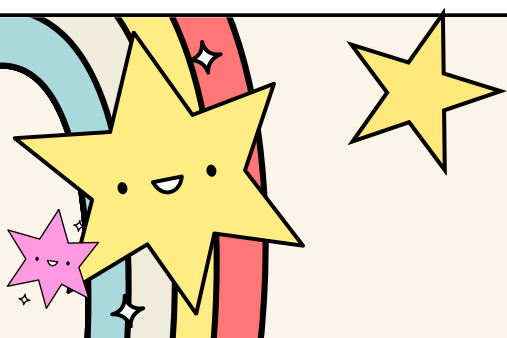

## NCES News

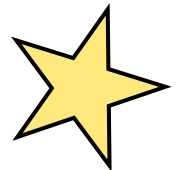

## Bus Safety

School bus fly-by update:

- Town of Barrhead: 10 recorded fly-bys
- County of Barrhead: 55 recorded fly-bys (numbers  
from the end of February)
  - the flyby numbers from 2024/2025 recorded -  
36

The Board maintains that even one fly-by is too many.  
Each instance represents a significant risk to student  
safety. We are committed to keeping the dialogue  
open with local law enforcement and municipal  
partners to find actionable ways to correct driver  
behavior and increase public awareness.

Goal: To ensure that every student who steps off a bus  
is safe from distracted or negligent driving.

## REDS FLASHING...NO PASSING

It is **illegal and dangerous** to pass a school bus when the red lights are flashing.

**KNOW THE RULES**

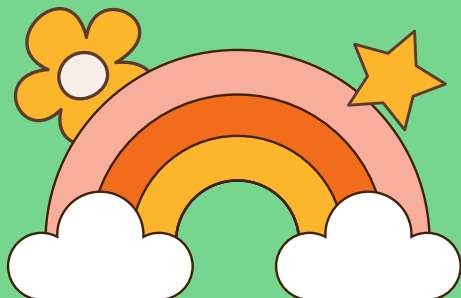
**TWO-LANE, UNDIVIDED ROADWAY**  
BOTH lanes must come to a complete stop and **REMAIN STOPPED** until the red lights have been deactivated.

**DIVIDED ROADWAY, NO MEDIAN**  
All 4 lanes must stop.

**DIVIDED ROADWAY, WITH MEDIAN**  
Traffic to the **rear** of the school bus must stop.

The penalty for passing a school bus when the red lights are flashing is \$567 and six demerit points.

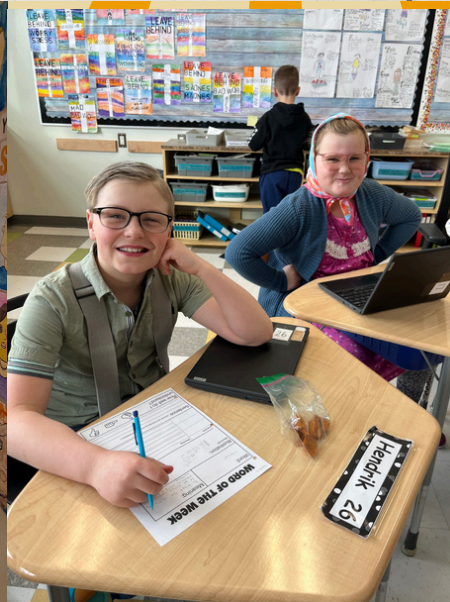

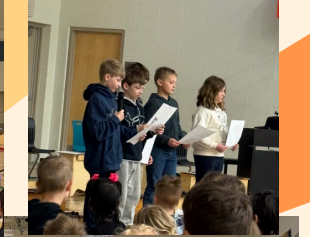
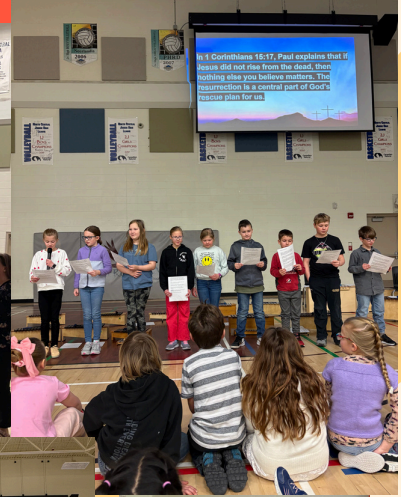

# Easter Assembly

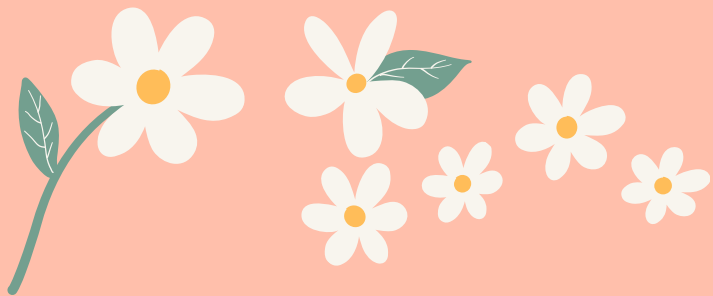


Grade 1 students went to the Foodbank and brought 374 items, weighing in at 351 lbs!!

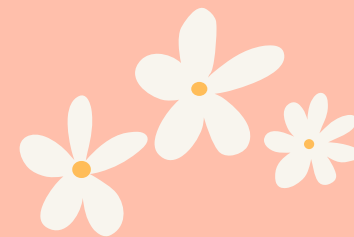

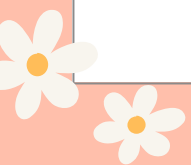

March 24, 2026

With spring fast approaching, many will gather and travel to visit loved ones. Measles is circulating in our communities and spreads easily, especially when people get together. Protect your family from measles.

**What is Measles?** Measles is a very contagious illness. It spreads through the air when someone with measles breathes, talks, coughs, or sneezes. Measles can make people very sick and, in some cases, it can be deadly.

**What is the Concern With Measles?** Measles can cause problems like: ear infections, deafness, lung infections (pneumonia), seizures, brain damage from swelling of the brain (encephalitis) and death.

It can be worse for young children, pregnant women, and people with weak immune systems. If you've had measles before, you're unlikely to get it again. However, measles can weaken your immune system, making it harder to fight other illnesses for a while.

**Signs of Measles:**

- A fever of 38.3° C or higher
- Cough, runny nose, red eyes, white spots inside your mouth
- A rash that appears 3 to 7 days after fever starts, usually beginning behind the ears and on the face and spreading down to the body and then to the arms and legs. The rash can be very red, brownish-red or purple depending on your skin colour.

Signs of measles can start 8 to 12 days after being around measles, but sometimes it can take up to 21 days.

**What to do if you have measles:** If you or your family have any signs of measles, stay home and away from other people so you don't make them sick. If you have a rash, stay home for four full days after the rash has started. Call **Health Link at 811** before going to a doctor, a clinic or a hospital and tell them you may have measles. They may tell you to go to a clinic or hospital, to get tested for measles, and how to help stop the spread of measles.

**Why is testing for measles important if you have signs of measles?** Testing is important to know if you have measles so you can get the best medical help and to help stop the spread of measles to others, especially babies, pregnant women, seniors, and those with weak immune systems.

**How to stay safe from measles:** The best way to keep yourself and your family safe is the measles vaccine. The measles vaccine works very well, is safe and free of charge.

- **Babies** who are six months, up to and including, 11 months old, may be recommended to get an early dose of vaccine. They should also still receive their routine two doses after they reach one year of age.
- **If you were born in 1970 or later**, you need **two needles** of the measles vaccine to be safe.
- **If you were born before 1970**, you likely had measles and are generally considered immune or safe from measles. You can get a single needle of measles vaccine if you have not received any measles vaccine previously.

If you or your children have not had the measles vaccine, or if you are not sure about what vaccines you have had, please call Health Link at **811** or your local health unit.
