## Field Trip Information



# Principal Message

At the end of April, when we celebrated Christian Education Week, we had the theme Notice, Wonder, Love. In the Principal Message last month, I explored the ideas of Notice and Wonder. This month, I would like us to consider Love.

When I used to have my own classroom at Neerlandia Public Christian School, I had a banner across the front that read "Love God, Love Others." Below that banner, I had Matthew 22:37-39 "Jesus replied: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself."

I told the students that those were really the only rules in my classroom ("Love God, Love Others") as every other rule would come out of those two things. I believe that the importance of these two statements is greater now than it has ever been.

At a recent Pembina Hills Principals Meeting, one of the administrators used the term "Age of Outrage" to describe our world right now. This really resonated with me, because I feel that social media algorithms are making me see one perspective passionately, to the point that all other perspectives are unequivocally wrong. Furthermore, this demands a strong and forceful response, without listening to what others have to say. After all, everything I am told shows me how wrong other perspectives are. But lately, I have been wondering how Biblical this stance really is.

If I am called to love others as myself, wouldn't I want to be heard and truly listened to, before someone makes judgements about me? Would I ever change my mind if I did not feel heard before someone shares their alternate opinion? Maybe following the first two elements of our Christian Education Week theme, engaging in Notice and Wonder with our brothers and sisters, will help us properly Love them.

I have told my children that if I feel good after correcting someone else, I must question if I responded to them in love. I know I have had the feeling of "there, now I have shown them" after correcting a brother or sister, but that seems to be more about me, and less about showing the other person love. I think it more properly shows love for others when I feel for the person I am interacting with, even when God is calling me to correct them.

My desire is to move out of the "Age of Outrage" and return to a "Calling to Love my Neighbor, as Myself." I have not arrived when it comes to this desire, but I am on the journey, and with God's help I will continue to get closer and closer to what He wants from me in my relationships. My prayer is that we can help one another truly follow what Jesus said are the greatest commandments.

## Sports

Jr. High students attended Track and Field Divisionals on May 26<sup>th</sup>. Job well done to all students who participated! We had 34 students that made it to Zones, they competed on June 3<sup>rd</sup> and represented our school very well! Congratulations!

## Pembina Hills News

The division is projected to receive approximately \$60.9 million in operational funding for the 2026–2027 school year, an increase of about \$3.6 million from the current year. Much of this increase reflects provincial funding provided to support negotiated teacher salaries.

Notable changes for 2026–2027:

- PHSD is moving toward a site-based decision-making model for school budgets. Principals will build their own school budgets within their overall funding envelope, rather than receiving a prescribed staffing allocation and needing central approval to move funds between categories.
- The Board will consider the final divisional budget for approval at its June 10th, 2026, regular board meeting. We moved our Budget and Ed Plan items into June because of the announcement of the welcomed \$200 million for class size reductions in the province. Our division has received \$405,000.00 (3 FTE). Senior Admin and Principals have met to discuss pressure points and will be presenting to the Board the allocation recommendation based on those conversations.
- 1 Complexity Class Team (located in Westlock) – 1 Teacher and 2 EA's. Ministry is allowing Divisions to be flexible in how this looks, as some divisions haven't been successful in filling these roles. We currently have 2 part time Teachers for the last part of the 2025/2026 school year. PHSD has had the posting open since the announcement of our allocation. We are hoping to have a teacher hired for 2026/2027.
- CASA Classroom (located in Barrhead) – Starting in January 2027, a CASA Classroom will open within the division as part of a partnership between CASA Mental Health, the Government of Alberta, and Pembina Hills School Division. This will cost the division 1 Full Time Teacher. This will bring specialized support directly into the classroom. Class size of 12 students per semester as well as a semester of integrating back into the classroom. This will target students from grades 4-12.

  - NCES/NPCSC welcomed 3 new board members at our AGM. Eva Visser and Arianne Mast in parent positions, as well as Lori Tiemstra as our Community/PCCE Rep. We look forward to what these ladies will bring to the table.
